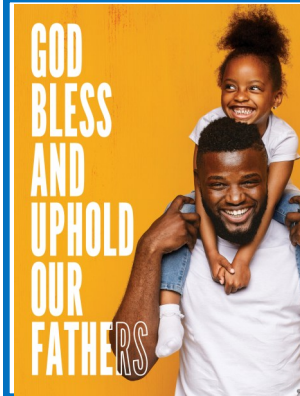
The Best Kind of Mystery
