April of this year. We will also visit additional sites made sacred during the Civil Rights movement, both in Birmingham and Montgomery.

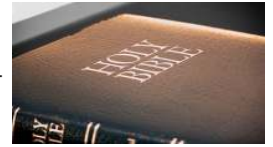
