CURÉ D'ARS CATHOLIC CHURCH NEWS



The bishops of the three dioceses of Colorado have announced that all public Masses have been canceled, effective immediately. This includes daily Masses. Parish offices will remain open for now.

NOTE: When Mass is unavailable, the Catholic faithful are released from their Sunday obligation.

At this time, we have determined that it is our responsibility to do our part to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The sacrifice of the Holy Mass will continue, but its public celebration will be suspended until it is deemed safe to hold large community gatherings. We ask all of the faithful to continue to keep the Lord's day holy and to join their sacrifices to the Mass from their homes.

COVID-19 is highly contagious, and while symptoms can vary widely, it is a serious and potentially fatal disease. By being proactive in stopping the spread of the virus, you can help save someone from unneeded suffering or death.

Funerals/Weddings (Consult your pastor)

A private celebration of the Mass, not open to the public for a reduced number of people (immediate family and friends) is permissible. If held, people should be able to be spaced out at least 6 feet apart. It is recommended to use the Rite outside of Mass for brevity and to reduce proximity to others.

All Other Gatherings (Consult your parish)

Other meetings, activities, prayer groups/gatherings are discouraged, but they remain at the discretion of the pastor. If held, people should be able to be spaced out at least 6 feet apart.
