Preschool not only helps prepare children for kindergarten and beyond, but also helps parents and guardians return to work. Licensed preschools are currently able to operate at full capacity in Colorado and most preschools in Denver have availability for the upcoming school year. To help protect students, their families and teachers alike, these preschools are following the state's safety guidelines.



I am a Preschool Navigator for the **Denver Preschool Program (DPP)**, a sales tax-funded program that helps Denver families find and pay for preschool. DPP offers tuition support on a sliding scale to all families—regardless of their income—who live within the City and County of Denver and have a preparing for kindergarten (they need to be 4-years-old by October 1, 2020 to qualify).

DPP has distributed more than \$122 million in tuition support and served more than 55,000 children since its inception in 2006.
